I am writing this letter in support of Reese Rigglin. I have known Reese and his family for approximately eight years through the Great Falls gymnastics community. During that time, I have also had the opportunity to work with Reese one-on-one while providing sound and IT support.

Based on my personal experiences with Reese, I have found him to be respectful, professional, and very aware of appropriate boundaries. When working with me, my employees, my clients, and others in the community, Reese consistently conducted himself appropriately. He was mindful of making those around him feel comfortable, avoided situations where he would be alone with others, athletes or customers, and demonstrated respect for the boundaries of others.

One thing that stood out to me was Reese's ability to remain calm and respectful even during difficult situations. I witnessed occasions where adults expressed strong opinions and made comments that I felt were disrespectful and unacceptable much less embarrassing. Reese did not respond with anger or confrontation. Instead, he would quietly remove himself from the situation, remain composed, and avoid escalating the conflict. He consistently chose to show restraint and respect.

I also heard many opinions from people about what they believed should happen to Reese, including comments about wanting him to return to jail. Despite hearing these things, Reese did not create scenes, argue, or respond inappropriately. He remained respectful and handled himself with maturity.

I understand the importance of safety, trust, and accountability, no matter what other actions or words were. My support for Reese is based solely on my own direct experiences with him over the past eight years. I have found him to be respectful, cautious, and mindful of his responsibility when interacting with others. He also has a good support system that is honest and, this system is in place to try and keep everyone involved secure.
I am a therapeutic foster and adoptive mother married over 40 years, foster parent over 28 years. Im a mandated reporter.

My name is Rodney Blake, and I currently serve as the Bishop of the Big Bend Ward of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. I have served in this volunteer ecclesiastical position for the past two years. I have also worked alongside Reese as he has served members of our congregation and community in many practical ways. I have personally observed him plow snow for others, help families move, reach out to individuals who were struggling, and perform numerous other acts of kindness and charity without seeking recognition.

From my personal experience, Reese has demonstrated a genuine desire to be a responsible citizen and a faithful servant of God. One example that stands out occurred just a few weeks before his confinement, when he contacted me out of concern for a family in our congregation who was facing significant challenges. My purpose in writing is simply to share my firsthand observations of Reese's character and the many instances in which I have witnessed him sincerely strive to serve others, strengthen his faith, and make a positive difference in the lives of those around him.

I've known Reese Rigg in the past 8 years, as we've attended church and social functions together, and our families frequented the same businesses in the community. I've only observed Reese to be kind and friendly, even to those who are unkind and judgmental. In recent years he's been teaching adult Sunday School in our congregation regularly, and the discussions he leads have been honest, kind, and engaging - he asks good questions, and treats everyone fairly and with respect. I see him at church very regularly, both teaching and being taught, and from my perspective he's been where he should be - at church surrounded by good influences, and trying to live a good way. Deserved or not, he's been the subject of outcry on multiple occasions, and he just keeps showing up and trying to live a good life. I don't know many people who could stand up to the intense scrutiny he faces daily, and still show up to church or work with head held high.

I've also been a patron of his family's businesses over the years, and I admire what he's tried to create - fun family entertainment, something Great Falls could frankly use more of. It's my understanding formerly incarcerated people can struggle to find employment after their release, and Reese has made the best of a difficult situation by creating multiple businesses in the community — he just keeps going despite headwinds from the many people who have had unkind things to say online and in person.

In the recent past, I was assigned to work with Reese in the Prison Ministry for our congregation. In my observations of his interactions with training staff, prison guards, and inmates, I've seen the same consistent behavior - Reese is kind and friendly to all, and shows a compassion for others we should all emulate.

In judging the recent allegations, it's my hope the court will be fair and kind.
